Last summer, 2022, Visit Rapid City approached RTS about acquiring the City View Trolley. After those discussions, Visit Rapid City officially purchased the three trolleys from the Rapid Transit System. With RTS staff volunteering their time to assist in the transfer, Visit Rapid City have begun operating their own trolley program. Festivals, Parades, and More!

Rapid City is full of wonderful summertime events that close down streets so our community can come together and have a great time. From Summer Nights to Car Shows, downtown Rapid City is a busy place in the summer.

Sometimes, these street closures can directly affect a bus's normal route. When this happens, we don't stress! Drivers will simply deviate in a manner that is safe, quick and misses as few stops as possible.

Don't be surprised to see a bus driving somewhere you don't normally see them. Usually, we are back on track in a jiff and most riders will not be affected.

RTS Parking: Yes's & No's

Yes: private vehicle parking in designated parking spaces on Apolda or 6th Street.

Yes: tour bus parking in designated parking spaces on Apolda.

Yes: utilizing designated "loading zones" for pick-up or drop-offs.

No: parking any vehicle in spaces labeled "RTS Only" at any time.

No: parking in any employee parking spaces in parking lot at depot (downtown) or bus barn (Center St.) at any time.

No: parking or driving through depot island (where buses drop off and pick up passengers).

Inside Peek: Bus Cleaning

How are the buses kept clean? In reality, it is a group effort by multiple staff members. Rapid Ride buses are cleaned daily by the drivers. The morning driver has some cleaning duties before the buses are ever on the road and the afternoon drivers finish the cleaning at the end of the day. Dedicated staff are responsible for washing the outside of these buses multiple times per week. For Dial-A-Ride, the drivers clean the inside and outside of their buses on a daily basis; sometimes before they hit the road and sometimes when they are done transporting riders for the day. Buses also receive a deep cleaning on a weekly, rotational basis. In the event of a mess in the middle of a shift, multiple staff members will come together to address the issue and get the bus back out on the road or swapped out if needed as quickly as possible to avoid delays for riders.



New City of Rapid City and RTS Holidays



In May, 2023 Mayor Steven Allender announced that the City of Rapid City will begin observing two new, federally recognized Holidays. Starting in 2023, City Office will be closed on Juneteenth and Native American Day. Consequently, the Rapid Transit System will have two additional Holiday Closures each year. "It is my hope Rapid Citians will utilize these two days as a time for critical reflection on the importance of Juneteenth as the anniversary of the end of slavery in America, and of Native American Day as an opportunity to recognize the spirit, the culture, the history and the impact of Native Americans – past and present – on our community and state," said Allender.

Free Travel Training for Youth and Families
